

First, Sir Alistair Rai is NOT a person! It is a fashion brand created by Kiran Rai to promote peace, social progress, pop culture and her East Indian heritage. Peace icons like Mohandas Gandi, Martin Luther King, Jr., Hindu deities and messages for peace have inspired this line of spiritual clothing. Her Indian heritage, rock style and fashion have created a fashion line that touches global hearts.

Kiran Rai, now a gorgeous 41 years old, lives in Gilbert, Arizona, and New York City. She was born in England to a traditional Indian family and went to school in Switzerland. She began her design line of fashion scarves and dresses that drew heavily on meditative writings from India. Sir Alistair Rai's motto reads, "Beauty relies on truth, wear your truth," and Kiran Rai makes it possible.



Kiran began her career in the corporate world working for Disney and Gap, Inc., but after ten year decided to put her creative talents to work for a bigger cause. Her first product was a line of t-shirts and in 2006 she began Sir Alistair Rai in Los Angeles. She used her own last name and added the "regal" Alistair and "knightly" sir to draw on her English birthplace. She said "I am a British citizen and I know I will never get knighted so I just thought let me have some fun with my label. A lot of the shirts are political so I thought it would be fun if we had somebody grand-sounding who wasn't me giving the commentary — so I just created Sir Alistair Rai," said Rai.

Her t-shirts read "Make Love Not War" and "Peace." Watch for more political messages from famous speeches, including one from Chief Joseph. While strangers won't be trailing you to read your t-shirt, you will have the knowledge of the message and, as a spiritual teacher would say, radiate your message.

In 2007 she added the message scarves to her line and in 2008 began added dresses, caftan, jackets and vests. This writer just happens to have one of her scarves and a beautiful vest! The multicultural patterns are very appealing for everyday looks and the Bohemian!

If you think she is too focused on the Hollywood celebrities and designer labels, she said that she has no problem balancing her political and celebrity infatuation. "This is how I see it: There are two sides to every person," Rai says. "I've been politically active my whole life, and I'm very well-read, but I also love the tabloid trash." Sir Alistair perfectly reflects both America's current celebrity obsessions and political hopes. "We're surrounded by all this horrendous stuff—the Iraq war, climate change," she says, "and gossip is an escape." [1]

#### Valentino, a Very Romantic Spring Line

If I were truly a rich woman and could wear any designer's clothes, that designer would be Valentino. As I watched his spring runway showing my heart opened and revealed the beauty and love that dwells in the fairy tales and the fantasy that I find in my books. Nature floats down the runway with the line that Valentino has presented for this Spring and Summer of 2012. Please let me win the lottery so that I can buy just one piece from this line.

I had asked myself a week ago, "Who, among the designers, truly reveals the Self of me?" And then I saw the YouTube video that is posted below. Yes, I have even actually been window shopping in Paris at Valentino's...but did not dare step through the door. I am not rich and I am not sophisticated enough to place myself under the scrutiny of the commissioned sales people in his shop. Window shopping was enough for me.

Who is this designer, Valentino, who has created designs for Jackie Kennedy, Elizabeth Taylor and Hélène de Rothschild?

Valentino, as we love to call him, is Valentino Clemente Ludovico Garavani, born on May 11, 1932, in Voghera, Lombardy, northern Italy. He became interested in clothing design in primary school and worked for his aunt. He then moved to Paris to help his mother Teresa de Biaggi and his father Mauro Garavani. There he studied at the École des Beaux-Arts and at the Chambre Syndicale de la Couture Parisienne. He apprenticed with Balenciaga and Guy Laroche and there gained clients like Elizabeth Taylor and Hélène de Rothschild.

After his training in Paris, and with the help of his father, he opened his own "fashion house" in Rome on the narrow and very fashionable Via Condott. Because of his time in Paris his "shop" was very grand and designed in the same manner as the Paris couture houses. His models were flown in from Paris for his first show.

Valentino became known for his red dresses, in the bright shade that became known in the fashion industry as "Valentino red."

On July 31, 1960, Valentino met Giancarlo Giammetti at the Café de Paris on the Via Veneto in Rome, who then became his business partner and lover. It would be the entrepreneurial sense of Giancarlo that created the vintage craze for Valentino gowns.

In 1964 Jacqueline Kennedy asked her friend Gloria Schiff who designed her gown. And later that year Valentino sent a model to Jackie's apartment on Fifth Avenue. She purchased six dresses. At the age of 79 Valentino designed an entire black and white wardrobe for the mourning Mrs. J.F. Kennedy. He would later design Jackie's wedding dress for her marriage to Aristotle Onassis. Valentino and Jackie became friends and she was a devoted fan.

Much has been said about Jackie's style. Her look was feminine and simple with a legendary ease... Her sense of elegance inspires me to this day." Valentino

By the mid-60s he was the master of Italian Couture and received the 1967 Neiman Marcus Fashion Award, the academy awards for designers. He was designing for kings and queens: The Begum Aga Khan, Farah Diba, Lee Radziwill, Queen Paola of Belgium, Babe Paley, Elizabeth Taylor, Audrey Hepburn, Gloria Guinnes, Marella Agnelli, Jayne Wrightsman, Marisa Berenson, Veruschka and Princess Margaret.

The film document Valentino, Giancarlo, and their six pugs in 2007 as they work to bring about his final couture show and a retrospective at the Ara Pacis museum follows the imperial Valentino Garavani, his lifelong partner Giancarlo Giammetti, and their six pugs across Europe in 2007 as they prepare one of his final couture shows and a retrospective at the Ara Pacis Museum. 

Most of my friends come for the food! A Bollywood themed party calls for more than just usual chips and dip! Get a list started of India's cultural cuisine because your friends will be calling you for ideas. You don't have to tell them what to bring, but you can head them in a fun and interesting new direction! Suggest a quick web search for snacks like street foods, including Bhelpuri, Tikki Chaat, Paani Puri, Papdi Chaat. **The Drinks** for a winter party might include Masala Chai or some Spiced Apple Cider. If it is hot outside, look for recipes for a Mango Lassi (sweet yogurt drink in a tall glass), Gulab Ka Sharbat (rose petals and pomegranate juice) or Badam Milk (cardamom, almonds, and spice in cold milk).

#### **Bollywood Party Music**



#### **BUT MOST IMPORTANTLY: WHAT TO WEAR?**


Bollywood fashion is driven by the characters in the movies, but certainly also by the Indian culture!

Some of the traditional Indian/Bollywood styles include the anarkali, salwar kameez, the Lengha and, of course the saree. Street style Bollywood includes pretty embroidered skirts, halter tops, and jeans, sandals and plenty of sparkle.



Anarkali: The Anarkali (pomegranate blossom) was a legendary slave girl from Lahore, Punjab (in present day Pakistan). During the Mughal period, she was supposedly ordered to be buried alive between two walls by the Mughal emperor Akbar for having an illicit relationship with the Prince.

Shalwar kameez alternatively **salwar** kameez or shalwar qameez—is a traditional dress worn by both women and men in South Asia and Central Asia. Shalwar are loose pajama-like trousers. The legs are wide at the top and narrow at the ankle. The *kameez* is a long shirt or tunic. The side seams (known as the chaak), are left open below the waist-line, giving the wearer greater freedom of movement. The kameez is easy and pretty and can be worn with leggings as easily as with the traditional shalwar pajama pants.

A **Lengha** is an Indian Dress worn along with **choli** on the top, thus also giving the name Lengha Choli. The Lengha come in three pieces the choli which covers the upper body like a Top or blouse. The choli is cut to fit the body and comes in various neck designs such as low neck or halter neck design. The Choli or the top ends above the waist level allowing the navel to be seen. The lower of the lengha is a skirt shaped dress. The Lengha comes with a **Dupatta** which is worn around the neck or used to cover the Head.

The **Saree** is the traditional length of fabric of various types and styles. They can be sheer, silk, silk dupioni, cotton, linen or synthetic. Many are banded and embroidered. Beautiful and exotic, the saree is a complicated item to wear, requiring much tucking and wrapping.



She is now the highest paid actress in Indian film industry and has won more than 100 awards since she was crowned Miss World in 1994. Her credits include both Indian and international films.


In 2003 she was appointed as a jury member in the Cannes International Film Festival and the first Indian actress to be so honored.



Without a lot of money for new clothes, I learned to accessorize at an early age. Sure, I made some mistakes, but it takes practice. Kaylene Ritchie from the *Pittsburgh Fashion Examiner* has a list of important tips for dressing up your clothing with those all important accessories that helped me share my thoughts (not rules) with you:

- 1. "Understand the Importance of Accessories." A few additions can completely change the look of a simple dress or top and show off your creative talents. After all, what you wear tells others a little about yourself. Pearls? Demure. Skulls? Rocker. Well, you get the idea. It's not supposed to be hard. Just be yourself and play with those scarves, belts, jewels and hats!
- 2. "Fab Bag + Fab Shoes = Success." I have heard for years that a girl needs to invest in one great bag and one great pair of shoes. In France, they look at your shoes to size you up: scruffy, relaxed, spit polished, athletic, or fashionista. Kaylene says that when you look at the stars they often wear jeans, a simple top and a fabulous bag and shoes. You don't even have to pay the highest prices! Look online, see what you want and search out something similar.
- 3. "Experiment with Colors." Monochromatic (all beiges, all black, all blues) is boring. Heighten your "second-look factor" by playing with the bright colors that are the seasonal trend. Turquoise and red look perfect on that black background. Try lavender with gray, deep burgundy with forest green, or a little butter yellow scarf with that light blue button down shirt if you are very conservative. Yes, you must experiment and remember the basic rule: "No matchy, matchy." Boring! Look at magazines; look at the artwork that appeals to you; look at nature! They are all color palettes that will help you.
- 4. "Experiment with Jewelry." A stylish woman does not have to be a rich woman with diamonds and pearls. A simple statement necklace with a plain top says you care about your looks and says a little about you. Get your jewelry out of that box and hanging up where you will see it. It takes only a second to try one piece and if that doesn't work, try another, until you feel fabulous. Piling on bangles and big bracelets is a fun trend this year. Try wrapping a bracelet or two around your wrist to

- get that built up look (more mileage for a beautiful strand of beads).
- 5. "You Can Never Have Too Many Belts." Thin, wide or chained, belts add a finishing detail or better fitting shape to your outfits. Again, don't be "matchy, matchy." Scarves wrapped around your waist and multiple belts are very fun statements of who you are. Maybe you just need to keep your pants from slipping down...but make sure that it compliments the colors you are wearing. There is a rule somewhere that says, "Black for blues and white. Brown for reds and beige. Silver buckles for black. Gold buckles for beige." Unless you are dressing to meet the Queen of England, who cares anymore? Another tip, from me, an accessory freak, get a wall mounted tie rack, or hijack your husband's, and hang your belts up where you can see them! You'll be taking better care of them if they are hanging up, too.
- 6. "Discover Your Inner Fashionista." "Scarves, bijoux belts, sunglasses, hairpieces, gloves, hats- unless you're determined to shop for designer accessories, you can afford to shop for the latest, trendiest styles and colors to add to your collection. Find your own way to be trendy, to make the trends work for you that's the true meaning of being a fashionista," says Kaylene. When the magazines throw those astonishing colors out there for the new season, find a necklace, a scarf, or a fun belt. You don't have to dress head-to-toe in that "new" color! Remember "chartreuse?" At least the scarf I bought didn't cost me much so that when the trend was demolished I didn't feel bad about giving it to the thrift shop. You know what you like! Don't be a slave to the designers...be yourself.
- 7. "DIY [Do It Yourself]" No money for accessories? Well, here is your opportunity to let your creative self shine. String some beads. Tie some leather strands together for some Bohemian bracelets. Slip a beautiful focal piece on a black piece of lace and tie it around your neck. Do you knit or crochet? Make yourself a beautiful long scarf. Look online for simple and easy ideas for styling on a budget. YouTube is full of them!
- 8. "Find the Perfect Balance." Yes, you say, this is the tricky part. You do not want to go overboard and end up looking like the circus just rolled into town. Kaylene says it so perfectly: "It's actually quite simple- if you're wearing a glitzy, bejeweled

dress/top, ditch excess jewelry (such as necklaces or long earrings) and opt for a bracelet or a statement ring instead. Glitzy dresses look best with neutral shoes (black or nude) and glitzy shoes will look ultra-cool if you pair them with a simple dress and impressive jewelry or a sexy sparkly top and a pair of skinny jeans (go easy on the jewelry). Plain, knitted dresses or turtleneck blouses, on the other hand, NEED accessories so don't be afraid to throw in a fur collar, long pearl necklace and your favorite medallion necklace!" Here, I say "scarf!" I might add that you need to be careful with proportions, too. A sleek outfit can take some big, bold accessories. But don't add those big pieces to that big, bold outfit! Instead neutralize and minimize the accessories so that the bold sweater or dress is the focal point. Jeans and a t-shirt...try some polka dot shoes, a scarf and that oversized bag. Chic, tres chic. Balance is a learned skill. It requires practice and experimentation... just like riding a bike. Go for it!
